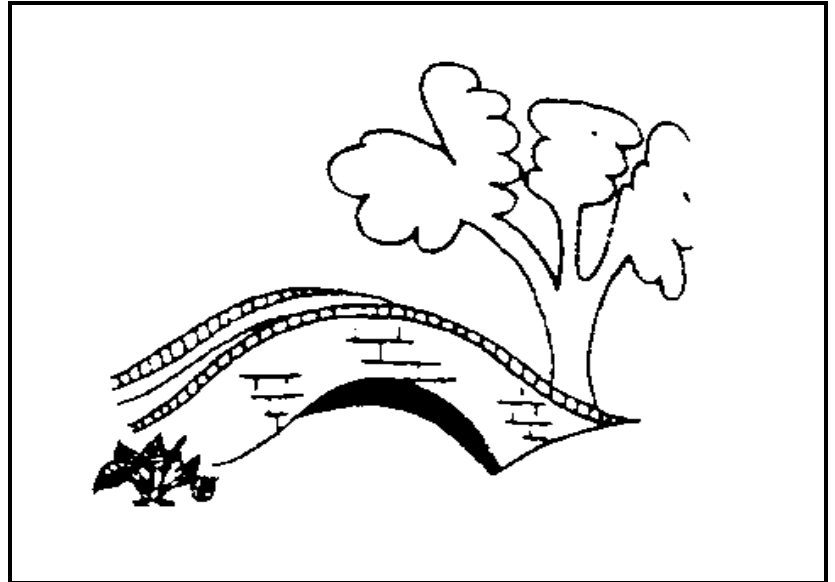

Curriculum Information for Parents

Autumn Term 2018

Skylark Class (Year 2)

English This term, children will be exposed to a variety of texts rich in meaning and make purposeful links to our 'India' theme. They will continue to apply their phonic knowledge and skills to decode and read by blending sounds, building on fluency and confidence in word reading too. They will sequence events and retell a wider range of stories. They will be introduced to non-fiction books and build up a repertoire of

poems. Children will have the opportunity to write about real events, rehearsing what they would like to write orally before writing their sentences down. They will begin by writing letters from a character in our first text and go on to write diary entries, narratives, instructions, fact files, recounts and information guides. Furthermore, we will provide opportunities for drama and role play to help children identify with characters and explore language in order to discuss and express their own views.

Mathematics Our work this term in maths will take a mastery approach. Children will cover reading and writing numbers to at least one hundred, use number facts to add three numbers within ten. They will also carry out work on 2D shapes and direction of movement, within our first unit. Children will then be learning how to find the difference between two values, count in twos and record repeated addition before applying this to multiplication. In our third unit, children will begin to share sets of items between two & four and solve simple division problems. This will lead onto work on fractions, finding halves and quarters. Children will study data handling; looking at tally charts, pictograms and block graphs. They will also continue to work on counting in steps of two, three and five from zero and in tens from any number, recall multiplication and division facts for the two, five and ten times tables including recognising odd and even numbers over the whole term and so much more!

Science This term the children will be studying the topic 'Animals, including humans'. In this topic the children will be identifying and naming a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. We will start by looking at our pets and move onto other common animals, including Indian animals. They will be sorting animals by their type, the ways in which they move and by what they eat. This will include learning the terms carnivore, herbivore and omnivore and finding out what animals eat. We will be investigating which types of seeds birds prefer and which snacks snails will choose. We will also be looking at the ways in which animals move and comparing their structures, looking at similarities and differences in their skeletons and teeth. Throughout the year the children will be studying a tree in the school grounds to observe and record the changes that take place throughout the seasons. This will include observations of the changes to the animals and plants that live in, on and under the tree and observing changes in weather and day length.

Humanities

We will be studying 'India' as our theme this term. The children will be identifying our the continents and oceans, locating India and the U.K. on maps & globes and learn about the varied landscape. They will learn about at the physical and human features within the country and find out about daily life in India. We hope to have a visit from an Indian dancer and taste Indian foods too.

P.S.H.E. (Personal, Social and Health Education)

Our PSHE unit, is called 'Be Friendly, Be Wise' through this unit, the children will be finding out about safety in and around school.

The children will also be considering their friendships and how to manage their feelings.

P.E. This term, during P.E. the children will be taking part in dance lessons over the first half term and gymnastics over the second half term. This will place on a Monday afternoon. The children will have the opportunity to express themselves creatively and will include Indian dances.

Art and Design Our work in Art is going to link closely to the Indian theme. Children will be experimenting with a range of tools and techniques in painting and printing. They will learn how to identify primary and secondary colours and mix tones. They will recreate characters from one of our English texts, also. Over the Diwali festival, children will manipulate clay to make pots and understand the need for safety.

Design Technology

Our unit during the second half term will be 'Electrical systems.' Children will create simple circuits and use switches for control. They will also, carry out some simple programming. This unit will have a Christmas theme.

R.E. Our work in RE this term, is focusing on 'Who do we belong to', we will be looking at groups that the children are part of outside of school, as well as the class that they are in. We will be discussing the clothes that show the children belong to certain groups. This will lead into a discussion about how people belong to a particular religion.

I.C.T. and Computing This term, children will be using a range of software to create digital content. We will also continue to teach the children about E-safety; using technology safely, respectfully and responsibly and keeping personal information private.

Music During our music lessons children will be learning several Indian themed songs and will have the opportunity to be expressive with musical instruments to accompany their songs. Children will look at rhythmic patterns and body percussion.

Spanish In our lessons this term, the children will be learning various Spanish greetings, they will be learning to count, as well as learning the Spanish names of colours and parts of the body. The children will also learn a variety of Nursery Rhymes in Spanish.
