| What is the Pupil Premium Grant? | |
| <p>Pupil Premium is an allocation of funding provided to schools to support children who may be vulnerable to underachievement. The Pupil Premium Grant includes pupils on the annual census known to have been eligible for free school meals in any of the previous six years, as well as those eligible at the time of the census. It also includes pupils who have been eligible for the Service child premium at any point in the last three years. All schools are required to report on the amount of funding and how this is being used.</p> | |
| Aims for the Pupil Premium Grant at Whixall C.E. Primary School: | |
| <p>The Governing Body of Whixall C.E. Primary School have decided that this grant will be most effectively spent on supporting children's learning in the classroom by providing high quality first teaching, curriculum support, targeted intervention, engagement and enrichment activities, pastoral support and social and behavioural intervention.</p> <p>As with all children at our school, in order to ensure maximum impact, the needs of children entitled to the Pupil Premium are clearly identified, steps are taken to meet their individual needs and their progress is closely monitored through school. Where small group / 1:1/2 support is felt to be most beneficial Pupil Premium will be used to support this provision.</p> | |

| CPD to continue to improve Quality first teaching. | £1500 | Continued and sustained improvement in quality first teaching. | All teaching judged to be at least good, to ensure that all children make expected or better progress. | All lessons observed were at least good |
| 0.1 specialist teacher to deliver specific interventions | £3800 | To ensure that all children make at least expected progress in core areas. | We track progress very carefully and the specialist teacher works closely with teachers to intervene early. FSM pupils are tracked and any dip in progress means intervention which is sometimes withdrawal in a focused group or within the classroom. | 100% of children working with specialist teacher, made expected or better than expected progress, from their starting points. |
| Extra – curricular activities | £600 | Ensure that qualifying children are able to participate in extracurricular activities, to provide equality of opportunity. | All children feel included. Raised self-esteem. Children learn new skills. | 87% of children who attended clubs regularly, said that they had learnt new skills and had enjoyed challenging themselves. |
| Curriculum enrichment | £3,200 | Providing opportunities to develop new skills and areas of interest. | Children able to take part in trips, music lessons and residential visits. Children can have access to two free after school clubs for week, to develop social skills and new areas of interest. | 100% of children said that enrichment activities taught them new skills, gave them more of a 'can do' attitude and let them undertake activities that they wouldn't have had otherwise. |
