Swimming gala will follow sessions this term.

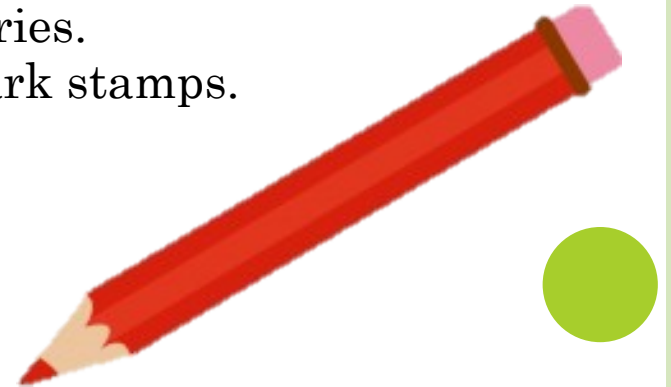
School uniform

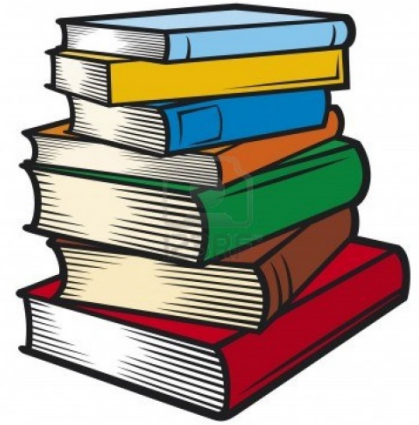
Homework

- Spellings, tables, sentences, English, Maths or topic will be given each week.
- Parents must record reading at home in diaries.
Prizes can be earned from reading bookmark stamps.



English this year

- Guided reading for each group 2x per week
- Independent reading on rotation
- Spellings taught throughout the week
- Focus on grammar in all lessons- we expect any writing to be of the same standard
- Expectation on more extended pieces of writing.
- Where possible, writing opportunities will be linked with the class text, visit or topic.



Maths this year

- Daily maths lessons
- Mastery approach- significant investment in the curriculum across the country
- Small steps approach with the aim of deepening understanding.
- Times tables are crucial. It is really appreciated if these are focused on as part of home learning
- Focus on number and place value through the year.
- Focus on reasoning about maths and problem solving.



Topic and science

- This term's topic is the Tudors
 - Visit to Nantwich on 8th October
 - Focus on Queen Elizabeth
 - There will be a topic project for homework on Henry VIII
 - Children may want to do some reading at home on one of these topics- that can be recorded in reading diaries.
- Science focuses on electricity and forces
- Year 6 have Safety Scene on October 10th



SATs

- Statutory assessments in Year 6
- Week beginning 11th May
- 1 or 2 papers to be taken each day from Monday to Friday
- SATs club will run from January
- Parent workshops in late January
